

DEFERRED DISPOSITION INSTRUCTIONS

If you choose the option of Deferred Disposition in addition to paying the original violation amount you must:

1. You must not have done a Deferred Disposition within a complete year of the date you are applying to complete the current Deferred Disposition probation period. It can only apply to one violation during the 12-month period. If you have more than one violation on a traffic ticket, you will be allowed to choose only one for DEF DISP.
2. You must submit a written request for Deferred Disposition. You may do so in a blank space on the plea form.
3. **You will be disqualified if you are ticketed for the following:**
 - a. If you hold a Commercial Driver's license (Regardless if the violation occurred in your private vehicle.)
 - b. Speeding 95 mph or more; or 25 mph or more over the posted speed limit.
 - c. Passing a stopped school bus.
 - d. Speeding in a school zone.
 - e. Speeding in a construction zone with workers present.
 - f. Leaving the scene of an accident; regardless if no one else is involved.
4. Pay an additional \$50.00 cash or money order - made out to **Justice of the Peace, Camp County** at the time of your written request to do Deferred Disposition. Final payment is due in full by your 30-day payment due date.
5. Bring your driver license & liability insurance card that states you are a covered driver & covers the vehicle you were ticketed for, to the office to make a copy for our file or mail a copy of each to the address below on or before the appearance due date.
6. Go to the DPS website at www.dps.texas.gov (official site) & choose "Request Driving Record" option underneath and submit on or before the appearance due date.
7. Print your 3 year driving record (type 3A) and bring it to the office or mail it when the Deferred Disposition is requested by mail on or before the appearance due date.
8. Your probation period of 90 days begins when the request has been received and the \$50.00 deferral fee must be paid. The payment period cannot be extended to pay it out beyond the 30-day payment date.
9. Your probation period requires that you **do not get a ticket of any kind anywhere within that 90-day period**. If you do not get a ticket during that period, your Deferred status will be granted and the violation will not report to the state when you follow instruction number 11 below.
10. If you do get a violation during the 90-day probation period, the case will proceed to a final conviction at the end of the 90-day probation period as though you were not granted the DEF DISP status. You will not be refunded the DEF DISP fee.
11. The day after your probation ends, you will need to submit to the court a written notarized statement as to whether you received a ticket for any reason anywhere during that 90-day period. You have 5 days to get it submitted – no exceptions. If we do not receive the statement, your Deferred Status will not be approved, the case will proceed to a final conviction and you will be scheduled for a Show Cause Hearing. **If you fail to appear to any court date, a Capias Pro Fine warrant will issue for your arrest.** If you wish, you may submit this statement by email to jcrainjp@gmail.com or to janice.crain@co.camp.tx.us.
